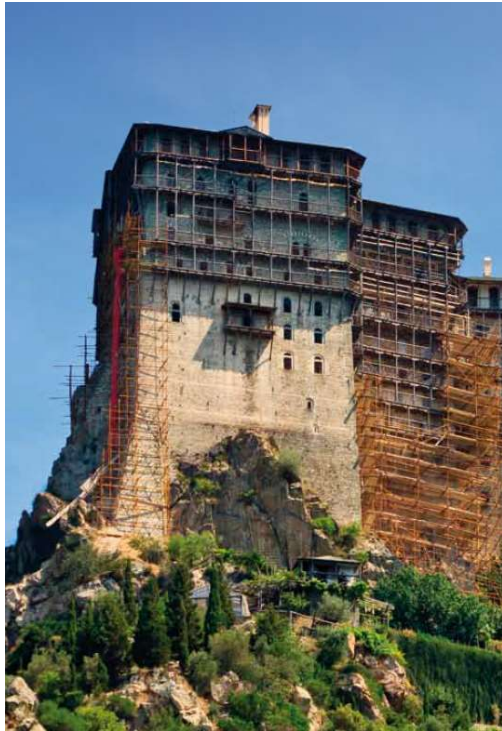

The vast and very important archaeological site and the ruins of early Christian churches are a clear indication of the town's cultural magnitude in antiquity. Today, a part of the ancient Agora (market place) remains as well as ruins of early Christian Basilicas (5th century).

Small Patmos Island belongs to the Dodecanese Island Group and its history spans 2500 years. The first historical reference to Patmos was made by Thucydides who described it as a rocky island.

Corinth

Circa 50 AD, the Apostle reached Corinth where he stayed for 18 months. The ancient monuments, the Byzantine churches and monasteries are the city's main tourist attraction. During his 3rd journey, Paul visited Lesbos, Chios and Samos, three beautiful North Aegean Sea islands.
